

### Inter-American Committee on Mathematics Education February 2020 Report

Three main actions were carried out during 2019:

 The realization of the XV Inter-American Conference on Mathematics Education, Medellín, Colombia, held on May 5-10, 2019.
Editing of a special issue of Cuadernos de Investigación y Formación en Educación Matemática (Journal of Research and Teacher Preparation on Mathematics Education) with selected papers from of IACME XV).
Creation of the Blog Educación Matemática en las Américas (Mathematics Education in the Americas).

1. The realization of the XV Inter-American Conference on Mathematics Education (XV CIAEM), Medellín, Colombia, held on May 5-10, 2019.



The XV Inter-American Conference on Mathematics Education (<u>https://xv.ciaem-iacme.org</u>) was held between May 5 and 10, 2019 in Medellin, Colombia. The University of Medellín and the University of Antioquia hosted the event. The sessions were held on the campus of the University of Medellín.

700 people from 25 countries on four continents participated: Europe, Asia, Africa and the Americas. More than 300 in-service teachers from Medellín, the Province of Antioquia (Departamento) and from other countries participated.

Around 400 papers were presented: plenary and parallel lectures, plenary panels, dialogues, mini-courses, topic sessions, short communications, workshops and posters. Some 50 personalities of the highest level in the international Mathematics Education Community presented their research. Among them Jill Adler (South Africa), Ferdinando Arzarello (Italy), Salvador Llinares (Spain), Yoshinori Shimizu (Japan), Michael Shaughnessy (USA), Luis Rico (Spain), Fidel Oteiza (Chile), Carlos Vasco (Colombia), Carlos Sánchez (Cuba), Luis Carlos Arboleda (Colombia), Edwin Chaves (Costa Rica), Nelly León (Venezuela), Vilma Mesa (USA). Although he could not be physically present, Ubiratan D'Ambrosio (Brazil) sent a video with his contribution. The Luis Santaló Medal was awarded to Salvador Llinares (Spain) and the recently created Marshall Stone Medal to Hugo Barrantes (Costa Rica) and José Chamoso (Spain).

The scientific organization was carried on by the International Advisory Committee, International Program Committee, Scientific Platform Directors (Open Conference Systems), 22 Topics Directors and 400 Scientific Reviewers from various latitudes, all with close coordination by IACME's Executive Committee.
